


YOUR LOCAL PARK UPDATE: METZGER PARK

Improved Park Pathways

In a survey conducted in 2023, the Metzer community ranked pathway improvements as a top priority project. With the support of the MPLID Advisory Board, staff have been working to implementing this project.

Over the last year, a landscape architecture firm developed a new path concept and presented at Advisory Board meetings. The project will improve existing paths and add new segments creating a walkable loop.

New Native Plants Garden

Washington County Parks has partnered with the Tualatin Soil and Water Conservation District (TSWCD) on a park beautification project. TSWCD and their contractors are creating a Native Plan Demonstration Garden with over 850 new plants!

The all-native plantings will add to the curb appeal, while promoting soil health and micro-ecosystems. Once complete, TSWCD will showcase the restored areas as an example on how residents can recreate this concept in their yards.
