



In May 2025, Washington County Parks completed a project to replace 50-year-old existing paths and add new paths to create a walkable loop at Metzger Park. The new and improved paths allow visitors to enjoy the park on foot or bike year-round.

Metzger Park Approved Budget

Need for Increase

Assessment History:

- Local Improvement District formed in 1975
- Maximum annual assessment has increased five times since the initial assessment of \$27,000
- Increased in 1988, 1995, 2002, 2019 and 2024
- Maintained the maximum annual assessment at \$318,000 for FY25/26

Existing Conditions:

- County General Fund contribution ceased in FY24/25
- Currently spending down fund balance
- Costs outside of our control will increase
- Playground equipment is nearing end of life
- Metzger community ranked playground replacement as their #2 priority
 - The pathway was the #1 priority and was completed in June 2025

Proposed increase means:

- Investment in growing fund balance
- Ability to pay for costs outside of our control
- Ability to replace playground with modern, safe equipment (estimated playground redesign/rebuild is \$1,000,000)
- Stable maximum annual assessment for several years (no anticipated increase until 2032)

Annual CAP cost increases (required charges which include... HR, finance, facilities, building depreciation fees)






Budget Forecast through 2030

REVENUE VS EXPENSES FORECAST



Estimate for Next Assessment Increase is 2032

	FY 2032	
Fund Balance Transfer	\$	44,497
Proposed Assessment	\$	639,000
REVENUE	\$	662,500
EXPENSES	\$	593,402

For the above projected expenses, minimum balance fund needed is \$51,625 (8.7%)

Proposed Plan and Timeline

Proposed Assessment Plan:

- Increase the maximum annual assessment from \$318,000 to \$639,000 for FY25/26
- Will roughly double the amount property owners contribute
 - If you're paying \$50 now, would increase to \$100 per year
 - 90% of properties in LID are residential

Next Steps:

- Send mailer announcing proposed increase to all property owners in mid-December
- Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing to set new maximum annual assessment on January 27, 2026
- If adopted, new assessment would take effect July 2026
